- No filling out individual day-use envelopes, no worries with correct change.
- The Day-Use Permit is designed to save money for the frequent forest visitor.

According to federal law, all of these passes must be accepted as payment IN FULL for Standard Amenity Fees.

Federal law does not authorize "Day Use" fees. The correct term is "Standard Amenity Fee" and such fees are defined in the law, with specific requirements, restrictions, and pass-acceptance rules.

National Forests and Grasslands in Texas

This pass entitles you to unlimited day use in participating fee areas forest wide for one year from month of issue. Recreation day-use fee areas in the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas include picnic areas, swim beaches, and boat launches.

Interagency Senior Pass, Interagency Access Pass, Golden Age Passport, and Golden Access Passport holders are eligible for a 50% discount on Day-Use Passes.

This pass is part of the Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act, approved by Congress in 2006. Your fees stay in the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas to help maintain and improve the recreation areas you enjoy. Your money may be used to upgrade facilities, improve information and customer service, and provide interpretation and environmental education. Please let us know what improvements you would like to see!

Hang this pass on your rear-view mirror or place on the dash.

It was actually enacted in 2004, as a rider on an unrelated spending bill, not as standalone legislation. There was never any congressional debate or a recorded vote.

What is covered

This annual pass is honored at fee areas operated by the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas; areas operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on Sam Rayburn Reservoir and Town Bluff Reservoir; selected areas on the Kisatchie National Forest, and Townsend.

What is NOT covered

- Fees for overnight use.
- Fees to reserve a picnic pavilion.
- Fees in other national forests across the United States.
- Some areas run by private concession that do not participate.

Senior and disabled passholders are not being given their legally mandated 50% discount on camping fees.

Private concessions are not being required to observe federal law regarding pass acceptance.
